





G20 Energy Transition Working Group Side Event

Just transition in coal mining regions in Indonesia and South Africa

Background

The transition away from coal presents both pressing challenges and transformative opportunities for countries that depend on coal for energy and employment. In coal-dependent economies such as Indonesia and South Africa, achieving a just energy transition means not only reducing emissions but also safeguarding livelihoods, promoting social inclusion, decent jobs, and sustainable enterprises, and creating new pathways for sustainable development. As part of South Africa's 2025 G20 Presidency, and building on the voluntary principles for just, affordable, inclusive, and clean energy transitions as adapted by the G20 Energy Transitions Working Group (ETWG) under Brazil's Presidency, this virtual policy dialogue offers a timely space to reflect on national experiences and strengthen cooperation among countries of the Global South.

This event marks the first in a series of five virtual policy dialogues jointly organized by the UN Partnership for Action on Green Economy (PAGE) and partners in South Africa and Indonesia. This dialogue will also feature as a G20 side event of the Energy Transitions Working Group in support of Priority Area 2 on Just, Affordable and Inclusive Energy Transitions. The dialogue sets the stage for knowledge exchange on just transitions in coal mining regions - drawing on actionable measures with practical insights, including under the Partnership for Action on Green Economy, from Indonesia and South Africa, and reflecting on the broader global policy agenda. The series will continue through November 2025, focusing on key building blocks of a just transition: social dialogue, skills development, financing, and international cooperation.

Session objectives

The objective of the session is to inform the non-negotiated Presidency G20 Document under Outcome 2 on Socio-economic Safeguards for Fossil Fuel-Dependent Regions, building on the outcomes of the first ETWG priority 2 outcome 2 side event on 18 June.

More specifically, the session objectives are to:

- Share progress, challenges, and opportunities in implementing a just transition in coal-reliant regions of Indonesia and South Africa;
- Highlight national strategies and social dialogue practices supporting the coal phase-out in both PAGE partnering countries;
- Foster mutual learning and solidarity between G20 and Global South partners.
